JAPANESE COMMUNITY JOINS WITH FAIR TO MEMORIALIZE VALLEY STORIES OF INTERNMENT

Most visitors who stream through the gates of The Big Fresno Fair each year probably walk right past the Commerce Building without even noticing a commemorative marker tucked away in a flower bed. Visitors are likely unaware that thousands of Japanese Americans from the Valley passed through those same fairground gates on their way to internment camps in 1942.

Now plans are underway to transform the area into the Fresno Assembly Center Memorial with the marker as its centerpiece. The Memorial will share the story of the Japanese American internment experience through storyboards illustrated with photos and commentaries by former Valley internees and their families. Banners featuring local photos from the period will also help educate visitors about the historical significance of the site.

A public awareness campaign encouraging former local internees to contribute their personal stories was launched at this year's Fair. Redesign of the area is expected to be completed in 2010, when an official unveiling is planned in conjunction with opening day of the Fair.

More than five thousand Japanese Americans from the Valley, including Fresno and Clovis, were temporarily housed at the Fresno Assembly Center from May through October 1942. The original California Registered Historical Landmark No. 934 which currently marks the site was dedicated on February 19, 1992, on the 50th anniversary of Executive Order No.9066. The Executive Order authorized by President Franklin D. Roosevelt was the basis for the internment orders.

"The Japanese American community is pleased to again partner with the Fresno District Fair to memorialize the internment of over 5,400 Americans of Japanese ancestry interned at the Fresno Fair. The Memorial aspires to teach a lesson in history that such injustices never recur," said Dale Ikeda, Chair of the Fresno Assembly Center Memorial Upgrade Committee.

The Big Fresno Fair Board of Directors approached the Committee last year to upgrade the Fairgrounds site following successful completion of the Pinedale Assembly Center Remembrance Memorial Plaza. The estimated cost of the Fresno project is \$100,000. Approximately half has been committed by contributions from the Central California District Council of the Japanese American Citizens League, Fresno District Fair and a grant from the California Civil Liberties Public Education Program. Contributions and sponsorships are being accepted to generate the rest of the needed funding.

A special groundbreaking observance will be held on February 21, 2010 at 4:30 pm at the Fresno Fairgrounds where the historical landmark plaque is located next to the Commerce Building. The groundbreaking will be followed by a Remembrance Day Reception and Dinner in the Education Building starting at 5 pm.

JAPANESE AMERICAN NEWSPAPERS IN NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

Hokubei Mainichi and Nichi Bei Times have ceased publication. Hokubei Mainichi announced to its readers that they would halt publication after the October 30 issue. Nichi Bei Times closed their operation in September.

For many years, both newspapers printed daily in Japanese and English. Nichi Bei Times went to a weekly, all English format some time ago. Hokubei Mainichi continued to be a daily newspaper in both English and Japanese. For many, these newspapers were the main source of the Northern California Nikkei community and they will be missed.

The Nikkei West Newspaper, an all English Language paper published every two weeks, continues operation. Based in Sacramento, it has been in operation for several years. The editor is Jeffrey Kimoto.

2010 Fresno JACL Scholarships

The Fresno Chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League (JACL) awards scholarships to graduating high school seniors who are planning to enter an accredited college or university, to continuing undergraduate students who are enrolled in a program at an accredited college or university leading to an undergraduate degree or to graduate students at an accredited college or university. The following are possible scholarships that may be awarded in the spring of 2009.

Masao and Hana Kimura Scholarship - The Kimuras owned and operated a grocery store in West Fresno for over 30 years. Since a large number of customers at the store were of Japanese-American descent, Hana Kimura made it preferable that the scholarship be made to a Japanese-American student. It is \$2,000 paid in four \$500 annual installments, available only to entering freshmen with a GPA of 3.0 or better.

Miyahara/Kusakai Scholarship - This \$500 scholarship was established by the Miyahara and Kusakai families in memory of Hiro and Day Kusakai's son. The Kusakais are Thousand Life Club members. Hiro Kusakai was a past president of the Fresno JACL.

Dr. Henry Kazato Memorial Scholarship - The original scholarship program began at the urging of Dr. Kazato in 1977 and was established by the Kazato Family. This \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a student interested in the medical field.

Barbara and Izumi Taniguchi Scholarship – This scholarship was established by the Fresno Chapter Scholarship Fund. Barbara and Izumi Taniguchi were both past Fresno Chapter Presidents. Izumi Taniguchi passed away several years ago. Barbara continues to be a Thousand Club Member. The \$1,000 scholarship is now funded by the Fresno Chapter Scholarship Fund and from contributions by the Taniguchi Family.

Fred Y. and Setsu Hirasuna Scholarship – This scholarship was established by the Fresno Chapter's scholarship fund in honor of Fred Y. Hirasuna. Fred was a past president. Before JACL was established as a national organization Fred was an active member of the Fresno American Loyalty League which subsequently became the Fresno Chapter of JACL. This \$1,000 scholarship is now funded by the Fresno Chapter Scholarship Fund and from contributions by Setsu Hirasuna and family.

Dr. Thomas T. Yatabe Scholarship – This \$1,000 scholarship was established by the Fresno Chapter Scholarship Fund in 1977. Dr. Yatabe was instrumental in the formation of the Fresno American Loyalty League which subsequently became Fresno Chapter of JACL when the national JACL was formed.

The Sally Yabumoto Slocum Memorial Student Aid Fund – This \$750 scholarship is a need-based award. Ayako (Sally) Yabumoto was born in Los Angeles in 1908. Her parents were from Wakayama, Japan. She was raised on a small farm in Chamero, New Mexico. She graduated from Gadsen High School in Anthony, New Mexico. She married Tokutaro Nishimura Slocum, an Issei and WW1 Veteran, in 1935. The family was interned at Manzanar in 1942. They moved to Fresno in August 1946. Ayako went to work at California State University, Fresno as a secretary around 1953 and retired in 1974. The Fresno JACL was a major interest in her life. She served as president. Before she died in May, 1991; she established this fund. Sally's family continues to support this fund.

JAPANESE AMERICAN CITIZENS LEAGUE 2010 National Scholarship Program Guidelines

The 2010 National JACL Scholarship Program's information brochure and applications are now posted on the National JACL website (jacl.org). The scholarship categories are Freshman, Undergraduate, Graduate, Law, Creative & Performing Arts, and Financial Aid.

All Freshman applications must be submitted to the Chapters and postmarked by March 1, 2010. Each Chapter must forward, postmarked by April 1, 2010, their "outstanding" applicants to:

There is no limit on the number of applications that each Chapter may forward to the National Freshman Scholarship Committee, but the Chapters are asked to review and screen the applications to ensure that only the truly "outstanding" applications are forwarded. The committee also welcomes any comments from the Chapters regarding the qualifications of the applicants.

The Undergraduate, Graduate, Law, Creative & Performing Arts, and Financial Aid applications must be mailed, postmarked by April 1, 2010, to:

All applications must be on the 2010 application forms that are found on the JACL website (jacl.org).

All applications must be complete and timely, per the guidelines on the form, in order to be considered.

Students are allowed to apply to ONE CATEGORY ONLY: Freshman, Undergraduate, Graduate, Law, and Creative & Performing Arts. The exception to this rule is that any applicant may also apply for the Financial Aid Scholarship.

Applicants are judged on the basis of their JACL involvement, scholastic achievement, extra-curricular activities, community involvement, personal statement and letter of recommendation.

Requirements:

- JACL Membership by applicant (Individual or Youth/Student)
- Personal Statement
- Letter(s) of Recommendation (only one required)
- Official transcripts
- the original and 2 copies of all application materials

In July 2010, the scholarship recipients will have been selected and electronic notification will be made to the recipients. Also, their home Chapter and the Chapter most proximate to their educational institution will be notified of the recipient. In September 2010, the JACL's national newspaper, The Pacific Citizen, will have its annual Scholarship Edition(s) featuring the recipients.

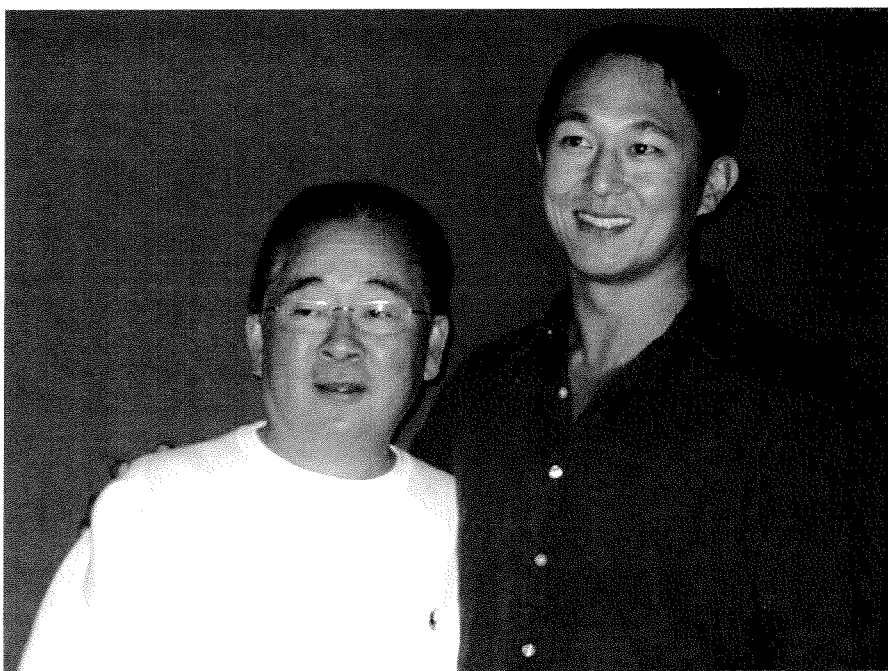
